Heifer International uses a program of strategically connected projects aligned with a long-term commitment that empower small-scale farmers around the world to achieve socially, economically and environmentally secure livelihoods. Heifer's programs are designed to unify their smaller projects to address large-scale, regional challenges.

LETTERS FROM SESSION

Dear RPC Members and Friends,

Recently the office received a call from someone looking for a place to have a wedding. RPC has a long history of welcoming those who want to commit to marriage in the eyes of God. A number of our members over the years were drawn to RPC through the very conscious wedding ministry of Rev. Roger Kunkel. Being welcomed by Roger celebrating their marriage, they stayed on and became integral parts of the RPC family. Roger's grace and RPC's acceptance in performing weddings was an affirmation of God's command to love one another.

Today, in the Presbyterian Church (USA), we have the opportunity to share this grace and acceptance with a wider swath of God's children than ever before. In 2015, the General Assembly voted to change the wording in the Book of Order so that church weddings could be celebrated by same-sex couples. Although no PC(USA) session is compelled to approve and no teaching elder to perform a same-sex wedding, each is now free to do so with the blessing of the denomination.

The call that came into the office recently was an inquiry for such a wedding. As it turns out, the session had not yet made a ruling as to whether RPC would host same-sex weddings, so a motion was made and a vote was taken. It is with great joy that the session announces it voted in favor of approving same-sex weddings on the same basis as all weddings that have been performed in our church. It is our belief that the sacrificial love of a committed marriage between two people pleases God. Encouraging such a love, and supporting its adherents through our own love and acceptance is what we feel we are called to do by God, and we feel it will be a blessing upon all involved as we do so as a church family.
