HUMAN SCENE — Join us in the Parlor at 8:30 am every Sunday as Human Scene features a series of TED Talks on a variety of subjects. We will reflect on these stories through the lens of our Christian faith.

June 11 – Former foreign minister of Norway, Jonas Gahr Støre, suggests that dialogue, even with our most radical opponents, can be a productive activity to attempt. In our polarized world, however, dialogue has broken down and is considered worthless. Støre presents some ideas of how it can be made to work.

June 18 – Psychologist Philip Zimbardo conceived and conducted the notorious 1971 Stanford Prison Experiment and is the author of the book "The Lucifer Effect," in which he explores the nature of evil. In this talk, "On the psychology of evil," he describes the conditions under which good people turn bad; and he ends by urging the nurturing of children to think of themselves as "heroes in waiting." We will consider how the church could contribute to this.

June 25 – In the TED Talk "How great leaders inspire action," leadership expert Simon Sinek discusses why some organizations fail to attract support and to achieve their goal and why others are successful in doing so. We will discuss how his ideas might be applied in the life of RPC for the sake of the ministry of Jesus Christ.

RIVERSIDE REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT — Our family from Eritrea should arrive this week. Here is more information about the country. Eritrea can be split into three ecoregions. Hot arid coastal plains, cooler fertile highlands and a subtropical rain forest.

Eritrea is part of a 14 nation constituency within the Global Environment Facility, which partners with international institutions, civil society organizations, and the private sector to address global environmental issues while supporting national sustainable development initiatives. In 2006, Eritrea also announced that it would become the first country in the world to turn its entire coast into an environmentally protected zone.

Eritrea has several species of mammals and over 560 species of birds. Eritrea is home to an abundant amount of big game species. Enforced regulations have helped in steadily increasing their numbers throughout Eritrea. Mammals commonly seen today include the Abyssinian hare, African wild cat, Black-backed jackal, African golden wolf, Genet, Ground squirrel, Pale fox, Soemmerring's gazelle, warthog.

Lions are said to inhabit the mountains of the Gash-Barka Region. There is also a small population of African bush elephants that roam in some parts of the country. The spotted hyena is widespread and common. In the coastal areas marine species that are common include dolphin, dugong, whaleshark, turtles, marlin, swordfish, and manta ray.
