WHAT'S WRONG WITH THE PIPE ORGAN? RPC's mighty pipe organ has been silent since 12/20/23. The Wednesday before Christmas Eve our ancient (1950's) blower finally gave out. The blower was one of the very few things not addressed when we did the Capital Improvement program in 2016. At that time the organ received a much-needed \$75,000 renovation. Christmas Eve was accompanied by piano and guitar. Almost immediately RPC friends and members began to send \$\$ to the Organ Renovation Fund. While we don't know the exact cost of the renovation yet, we have started a very healthy fund for the renovations. Our organ technician is currently working on the extent of the repair. More checks are welcome of course! Should you choose to give online please indicate Organ Renovation Fund. Until the organ returns, there will be no postludes. The silence is deafening.
