

THEOLOGY ON TAP resumes January 15, 2018.

We gather at 6:30 for dinner and our discussion begins at 7:00. We meet at Grapevine, 9 W. Hillgrove Ave, La Grange, IL. If you joined us while we are meeting at Molly's Pub and found the atmosphere too noisy, please give the Grapevine a try.

We are reading *A Bigger Table* by John Pavlovitz. The book asks if organized Christianity can find a new way of faithfully continuing the work Jesus began two thousand years ago, where everyone gets a seat.

Pavlovitz shares moving personal stories and his careful observations as a pastor to set the table for a new, more loving conversation on these and other important matters of faith. He invites us to build the bigger table Jesus imagined, practicing radical hospitality, total authenticity, messy diversity, and agenda-free community. HUMAN SCENE — December 31—No Human Scene.

A hymn is a type of song, usually religious, specifically written for the purpose of adoration or prayer, and typically addressed to a deity or deities, or to a prominent figure or personification. The word hymn derives from Greek, which means "a song of praise." A writer of hymns is known as a hymnodist. The singing or composition of hymns is called hymnody. Collections of hymns are known as hymnals or hymn books. Although hymns are most familiar to speakers of English in the context of Christianity, they are also a fixture of other world religions. Hymns also survive from antiquity, especially from Egyptian and Greek cultures.

For the first two Sundays of the new year, Dennis Cobb will lead Human Scene and focus on the church's use of hymns in worship. Singing has always been a part of worship. Why is that? What does the choice of hymnals and the hymns in them say about our theology and religious beliefs?
