The Trustees have consulted with several arborists and foresters and the difficult decision has been made to remove it. The tree has already dropped a large limb damaging the street lamp and more limbs will follow if left unattended which is a liability risk. We are working on a way to preserve a piece of the trunk to be displayed in the church. The Trustees will also begin developing a plan to allow members an opportunity to contribute to its replacement.
