

FIFTH SUNDAY: September 30 — Caring for the Community and being Christian includes caring for our environment and the world that God created! On September 30th we will be doing ecological restoration at Arie Crown Forest Preserve, 6800 LaGrange Road in Countryside, in conjunction with the Des Plaines River Valley Ecological Restoration Project. The work will be physically demanding (but oh, so rewarding), so dress appropriately. Dress for the weather, also closed-toes shoes, (NO open shoes or sandals), long pants, long sleeve shirts, maybe a baseball hat. The site stewards will supply tools and gloves, and give direction/instruction, as well as some history. We will start with brief introductions to each other and to the Arie Crown Forest Preserve. The work may include sawing, lopping, carrying and piling brush, pulling weeds, burning brush piles, maybe collecting or scattering seeds. We have reserved a picnic shelter (Thank you Matt Lisle). There are plenty of tables in the picnic shelter. We will plan to share a meal together after the workday. More specific schedule details will be provided, but as usual, we will meet at the church at 9:30 AM and carpool to the site.

IRUKA AJEMBA MEMORIAL - A GoFundMe campaign has been launched to raise funds for a grave headstone for Iruka Ajemba, the Nigerian woman who worshipped with us in early 2016 prior to her tragic death.
