

Communion Sunday

Here are two bread recipes you might like to try!

MEALIE BREAD (South African Sweetcorn Bread)

Yield: 1 (9x5) loaf of delicious cornbread

Ingredients

½ c milk, 2 Tbsp salted butter, melted, 2 eggs, 2 c sweet corn kernels divided,

1 ½ c unbleached all purpose flour, 2 Tbsp cornmeal, 2 Tbsp sugar

2 tsp baking powder, 1 tsp salt, ½ tsp paprika

Method: Preheat your oven to 350F. Butter a 8 ½ x 4 ½ loaf tin.

Place the milk, melted butter, eggs, and 1 cup of corn into your blender and blend until evenly mixes and the corn is nicely pureed.

Add the flour, cornmeal, sugar, baking powder, salt, and paprika to the blender. Blend until a smooth batter forms.

Add the remaining 1 cup of corn and blend just enough to chop the kernels coarsely and mix them well into the batter.

Pour the batter into the prepared pan.

Bake the mealie bread for 45-50 min. Until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean.

Cool the bread in the pan for 5 minutes before turning the bread out onto a wire rack to continue cooling.



QUICK INJERA—An Ethiopian crepe like bread. Yields: 6 to 8 crepes

Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, 1/2 cup Whole wheat flour, 1 Tbs Baking powder,

1/2 Tsp Salt, 2 to 2 1/2 cups Club soda, Lemon juice

Method: Preheat a large cast-iron skillet over a medium flame. Mix the all-purpose flour, whole-wheat flour, baking powder and salt together in a large bowl.

Stir in the club soda and mix to a smooth batter. It should have the thin consistency of a pancake batter.

Wipe the skillet with a little oil using a paper towel. Ladle about 1/2 cup of the batter into the skillet and spread it with a spatula to make a large crepe. Let bake in the skillet until all the bubbles on top burst and begin to dry out, about 2 or 3 minutes.

Carefully turn the injera over and cook on second side another minute or two. Try not to brown it too much.

Remove the injera to a warm platter and repeat with the rest of the batter, wiping the skillet clean with an oiled paper towel each time.

After the batter is used up, use a pastry brush to brush each injera with the lemon juice. Serve immediately or hold covered in a warm oven.



September 27 We turn our attention to stewardship. What does it mean to be grateful? Does gratefulness impact the ways in which we support the church? Our theme verse is Jeremiah 17:8 *They will be like trees planted by the streams, whose roots reach down to the water. They won't*

fear drought when it comes; their leaves will remain green. They won't be stressed in the time of drought or fail to bear fruit. Reverend Jackson will also be using the poetry of Mary Oliver who said *Instruction for living a life. Pay attention, Be astonished. Tell about it.*

October 4 is World Communion Sunday. Next week watch the announcements for international recipes to bake your own communion bread. The service will celebrate the fact that Christians all over the world share one table.

October 11—November 14 *A Way Out of No Way*. The title comes from the African-American expression that grew out of contexts of oppression and the trust that God and a tenacious people make a way in spite of the situation. We will enter the biblical narrative of God's action in human history "already in progress" and right out of the gate we are plopped down in the middle of major crisis: Noah and the flood. We will spend six weeks witnessing other Hebrew Bible stories of God urging the people forward in times when it seems there's no way out. We will recall our own narratives and affirm the strength God gives us to find a way through. After all, our percentage of actually living through a crisis at this point is 100%!
