

2020 CHURCH TRIP — Have you ever dreamed of seeing the Blue Mosque and Haga Sofia in Istanbul? How about floating around in the Aegean Sea, stopping at Santorini, considered the most breathtaking of the Greek Isles, and several other islands? Or walking among the ruins of the Parthenon on the Acropolis in Athens? You can do all that as well as walk in the towns that inspired Paul's letters and visit the cave where John was said to have received the Revelation if you join us on our RPC trip to Greece & Churches of the Revelation. The trip is June 12-June 24, 2020.

COMMUNION — Wine has been used in Communion celebrations for the past 2,000 years. That is until about 1869 when the temperance movement, which had been building momentum since the 1820's, was in full swing and congregations were wondering what to do. In 1869 Thomas Bramwell Welch in an effort to provide his Methodist church with a nonalcoholic alternative to communion wine figured out how to pasteurize grape juice and many churches started serving juice.



When communion is served by Intinction (when we come forward) a blush wine will be served in bowls and juice in the chalice. When communion is served in the pews the glasses in the center of the tray will have blush wine and the outer rings will have juice. You will have the freedom to choose which you desire. Parents it is up to you to decide between wine and juice for your child; the consumption of alcohol by minors in the state of Illinois is allowable for religious purposes.

CARERS CORNER JULY — Back to School The RPC annual school supplies drive this July will focus on ELEMENTARY school children from our West Suburban communities. Baskets will be lined up in the office entrance hallway. Each will be labeled with the needed items. Community Support Services headquartered in Brookfield will distribute all donations. The CARERS Trunk will also be accepting non-perishable food items for our own RPC Little Food Pantry.



ALL CHURCH WORK DAYS — RPC Trustees invite everyone to All Church Work Days —actually just 2 hours per month — to help maintain and enhance our church property. IMMIGRANT AND REFUGEE CHILDREN —

Have you been wondering how to help with the crisis at the border, especially as it impacts children? Susan Krehbiel from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has provided the following advice:

1. Do you want to send something? Do not send items such as soap or toothbrushes or the like. The facilities cannot receive these because of government procurement policies. Instead, send money to PDA which is working with organizations to help families at the border. They provide shelter when they are released, help with transportation, items for the bus, medical attention. <https://pda.pcusa.org/situation/refugee-ministry/>

You can also send money to organizations supporting the “Know Your Rights” campaign that assists people to know their rights under the U.S. Constitution.

2. Do you want to affect legislation? Contact the office of your Representative or Senators to express your opinion on this issue. Organizations that monitor current legislation will be able to keep you abreast of any bills moving through the Congress.

3. Do you want to do something in Chicago? Many of the children, some of them still unaccompanied, end up in Chicago. There is an organization supported by our friends in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America called AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities; <https://www.elca.org/ammparo>). This organization provides one on one response to the children. You can also check with legal aid societies or the ACLU in the Chicago area about ways to be present in court when children and families must appear before a judge. This provides support to the families and children; it also helps judges to know that the community is paying attention to what happens.
