


Childcare is available for children through 1st grade after the Mini Message.

**TODAY WE WELCOME REV. DR. JORGE MORALES** — Rev. Dr. Morales is the former Conference Minister of the Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ (retired June 2018). Prior to that, he was Illinois Conference, Associate Conference Minister for Stewardship and New Church Development. For ten years he served as Senior Pastor at the First Congregational Church of Chicago. Additionally, Pastor Morales has contributed to the establishment and founding of a number of church and community-based institutions.

He holds a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from McCormick Theological Seminary. In 1973-75, while a student at McCormick, he helped establish and later coordinated the Hispanic Ministries Program. His spouse, Martha M. Mendoza is the Christian Education, Youth Ministry Director at the First Congregational Church of Elmhurst. They live in Elmhurst IL and have four children.
