#### WELCOME TO THE ABDU JABAR

FAMILY — We've learned that Jumaah is one of eight children. Her parents, she, and all of her siblings fled Burma in 2012 and have lived in Malaysia since then. Through the mystery that is refugee resettlement, little by little members have been approved to come to the US. With the arrival of Jumaah and her family, only two brothers



and their families remain in Malaysia. The Rohingya people are not provided education or refugee status in Malaysia. They are considered illegal immigrants and have no rights, though in contrast to Burma, do not fear genocide. You can support their transition through prayers and responding to calls for items they may need as they settle into life in Chicago.
