## Christmas is not *Your* Birthday

When a birthday comes around, people usually think about what they might do to add a little joy to the birthday celebrant's life. Sometimes they even ask, "What may I do for your birthday?" Or, "How do you want to celebrate your birthday?"

As a rather typical (i.e., uncreative) male, I feel like it is a great blessing when the birthday person tells me specifically what is most desired. I am not skilled at guessing what people want.

In December, there is often a feeling in the air that it is *everybody's* birthday. And, I suppose, in some spiritual sense, there is a grain of truth in that. But, we tend to overstate that part of the equation. We tend to focus on what will bring joy into *our* lives at Christmas (material pleasures), rather than focusing on what would bring joy into *God's* life at Christmas.

We are very fortunate to be spared the struggles of having to guess. God sent Jesus to live among us, and one result of that incarnation is that we now know what God wants of us for Christmas (or for any other day).

It is always appropriate to say the words "Happy Birthday" to someone who is enjoying such a day. But words alone are usually considered a little hollow, especially if it is someone whom we truly love. Likewise, it is always appropriate in prayer to say to God, "Happy Birthday" on Christmas Day. But words alone are a rather meager effort.

One of the things that God desires of us, according to Jesus, is our worship (in Spirit and in Truth). This year, Christmas Day falls on a Sunday. Yes, we will have worship on Sunday morning, December 25, at our usual time. It will be an informal/participatory service designed to say "Happy Birthday" to God. What more important event might one plan for such a day?

Related to worship, Session has recently discussed the phenomenon of applause during worship. Of course, everything in worship is designed to praise the living God. And, the way that we all praise the living God has certainly changed over the years. Musical instruments and musical styles, language conventions and length of sermons, *etc.*, have changed dramatically since Christ's day. But, no matter what style we use, we should never lose sight of the fact that it is God who is the recipient of our praise. There is nothing "illegal" or "wrong" about applauding during worship, but we should always remember that it is God who is the giver of all variety of talents, and it is God whom we adore during worship. "Clapping hands" for God is even advocated in the Bible.

But, maybe we could do more. So, what will you do this year to wish God a "happy birthday?"

## December Worship Schedule

**December 4** ▪ *Mark 1:1-8* "How Jesus Saves Us" What does John the Baptist expect as the result of Christ's incarnation? How will our lives be different? How should we prepare for that change? According to John, Jesus will bring the gift of the Holy Spirit, and we prepare for that gift by confessing our sins. What, then, is the gift of the Holy Spirit? We will have communion today.

**December 11** ▪ *Luke 1:26-38* "In God We Trust" Why does Mary decide to trust God? Could she have said *No*? What does she stand to gain by agreeing? What assurance is she given that things will work out for her? As we wait during Advent, why should we trust in God's providence? What alternatives did Mary have? What alternatives do we have?

**December 18** ▪ Children's Christmas Pageant - The Children of RPC will lead us in an old-fashioned Christmas Pageant, directed by Jenny Kolinski.

**December 24** ▪ Christmas Eve Candlelight Services at 4:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. - Both services will feature traditional scripture lessons and carols. The early service will have more of both, and electric "candles." The late service will have fewer lessons and carols, but also a bit of commentary on the scriptures and wax candles.

**December 25** ▪ *John 1:1-14* Church Family Christmas - This will be a very informal service with some traditional carols (more than three). Instead of an ordinary sermon, there will be a bulletin insert with some discussion questions relating to the scripture reading. We will consider those questions as a congregation in order to better understand what Christmas means to each of us.

**January 1** ▪ Evaine Stahrr will be our guest preacher today while Scott is away from the office.

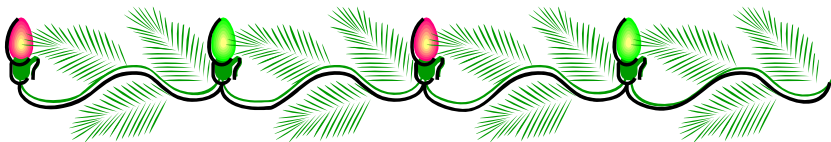

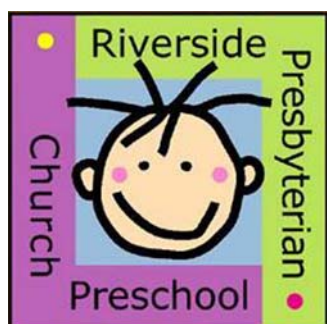

## December Human Scene

**December 4** - Join Ron Smith for *A good five cent cigar!* The social-political-economic problems of contemporary life seem to be overwhelming, but an analysis of various historical periods may provide us with some "food for thought."

**December 11 & 18** - Pastor Scott will present a Human Scene class on Sharon Baker's book, [\*Razing Hell\*](#), which challenges Christians to rethink their traditional views of hell and/or eternal punishment and invites them to consider an alternative that is more consistent with the revelation of God in the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Baker believes eternal hell – the belief that God would punish without end those who have rejected him in time – is one of the most disturbing notions in Christianity. Therefore, she asks us to join her on a quest for a new view of hell that permits us to affirm with Scripture that, while nothing impure will enter the gates of God's holy kingdom (*Rev. 21:27*), there still will be a day when "at the name of Jesus every knee will bow... and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord (*Phil. 2:10-11; see also Rom. 14:11*)."
