The Vision

January 2012

The Presbyterian Shuffle

That title might have you imagining some strange new dance where one cannot move until a committee votes on it (a rather scary thought), but that's not what I mean. At the beginning of each year, the church always goes through a process I call the Presbyterian Shuffle. The Shuffle starts with officers: elders, deacons and trustees. Some rotate off of service as their terms end, and some rotate back on to service as they begin new stints, and others are ordained for the first time.



For the most part, by the time you read this article, this stage of the Presbyterian Shuffle will have been completed. But January is the time when the church as a whole gets out on this dance floor. All of the new committee chairs have been settled and it is time to think about who will be serving on those committees.

There are a few Presbyterian principles to keep in mind as we do this dance. First, we believe that everyone is a sinner. That is why power should be spread out broadly. Whenever one person can unilaterally make major decisions, there is trouble. Such power tends to corrupt a person. For this reason, every office has a term limit. Likewise no one should feel compelled to serve as a volunteer in some role "until death." Many thoughtful and diligent workers would never volunteer in the first place if they felt that volunteering meant being stuck with a job until death. Term limits and the drive for "new blood" (notice the cool vampire reference) tend to spread power out among us sinners.

The second principle is that different parts of the body have different talents. We are not interchangeable Legos. You should serve where your talents lie, not wherever there is a hole. This principle is in some tension with the first one.

The third principle is that EVERYONE has talents. The Holy Spirit is connected to every human. God does not treat us all the same, but, in some way, God loves each of us, blesses each of us, and calls each of us. No one is bereft of talent. But, because the Spirit spreads talents around so broadly, all of our big decisions are best done by committees, not individuals. Two heads are better than one.

What do these principles mean to you? If you are serving a committee and feel that your talents are being well-utilized, great—volunteer to stay another year. If you are serving a task that does not seem well-suited to your talents, quit, and move on to some other committee. If you're not volunteering to serve anywhere at all, consider your response from God's perspective. God is the one who blessed you with those talents in the first place.

Let's get the whole church this year! Let's all do the "Presbyterian Shuffle."

January Worship Schedule

January 1 Luke 2:22-40 "Welcoming Jesus"

Instead of a sermon, today we will have a list of discussion questions drawn from the scripture lesson. Lynda Nadkarni will moderate a congregational discussion on these questions, so it would be useful to read the passage ahead of time. There will be a few extra Christmas carols. We will not be celebrating Communion today, contrary to our custom, because of Scott's vacation.

January 8 Mark 1:4-13 "An Adopted Deity?"

We usually look to the entire Bible and harmonize it all to develop our understandings of God. But what image of Jesus' divinity is portrayed by Mark—the earliest gospel? Why was Jesus divine, and how did he get that way? How does Mark's portrayal differ sharply from the other gospels? Does it matter which theory we prefer? Today we will be celebrating reception of new members and we will celebrate Communion (instead of doing so on January 1).

January 15 John 1:43-51 "Come and See"

How do we come to have faith? Is it based on rational analysis and argumentation, or on our own experiences? Nathanael had good reasons to doubt Jesus, but his experience changed his mind. Why does Jesus compare himself to Jacob's ladder? Today we will ordain new church officers and commission them.

January 22 Mark 1:14-20 "Leaving Our Nets Behind"

Why did Simon and friends leave their nets behind? Why not pack them up in storage or sell them? How do we become ensnared by the values of the world? What would it mean for us to "fish for people?"

January 29 *Mark 1:21-28* "Commanding Unclean Spirits"

Why do unclean spirits have such an easy time in the gospels recognizing Jesus, while everyone else struggles with his identity? Why do those who are most spiritually troubled often seem to have the strongest passion for their faith? Can we develop such strong passion without having the troubles? Today we will also have the annual congregational meeting after worship.

- noted with sadness the deaths of Dorothy Jansky, Charlotte Graf, Allen Ashby and Willa Vogel Lahey;
- called the Annual Congregational Meeting for January 29, following morning worship.

We are winding up our pledge drive efforts and would like to thank all of you who have helped out. However, we are still in need of additional donations. Our current 2011 budget deficit is \$52,000. We are going into 2012 with a projected deficit of \$77,000. The amount of pledges received for 2012 is down \$46,000 from last year's giving with 28 fewer members contributing. We are facing a serious budget shortfall. If you have not already pledged, please consider doing so. Also, our church has to pay the per capita contribution for each confirmed member in January, so please pay your family's share, \$30 per member. We understand that these are difficult economic times, but our spiritual family and home are in need of our resources too.




Save the dates for these upcoming fellowship events:
