This particular service will be focused on the Riverside Presbyterian Church during this time of transition: for healing, for bridge-building, for hope for the future, and for God's blessing as we go forward. We will pray for God to help us in every way so we can become all God intends for us to be.

Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective.

Session Notes

In December, the Session:

- voted to cancel the 10:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service due to lack of available worship leaders.
- called the Annual Congregational Meeting for Sunday, January 25, following the worship service.
- approved a Service of Prayer and Healing to be conducted by Rev. Rosencrans on January 18 at 4:00 p.m..
- discussed the proposed budget for 2015 and RPC's finances at great length; a budget of \$201,839 was approved. In addition, it was approved to convert the present RPC deficit of approximately \$75,000 to a debt by borrowing from the Endowment Fund, to be repaid during 2015 with interest.
- directed that a letter will be sent to all members concerning RPC's finances and encouraging additional donations to eliminate the deficit, and to assure there are sufficient funds to call a new Pastor.
- received Megan Jean Huisingh-Scheetz as a new member and approved the baptism of her daughter, Elowyn Lily Scheetz.
- accepted, with regret, the resignation of long-time member, Doris Miller, who has been living in Batavia.
- established a deadline of 5:00 p.m. on Wednesdays for submitting announcements to the RPC Office for inclusion in Sunday worship bulletins.
- ♦ thanked the Trustees for offering to assume the duties of the Building Supervisor, which will save RPC an estimated \$10,000.

CARERS Corner



Imperfect as we are, it is our job to, in turn, now tell the Good News to others. It matters not how well we tell it, but only that we do go out and tell it.








Presbyterian Women's Bible Study

Human Scene

January 4 — **Ishmael and Isaac: Blood Brothers or Sibling Rivals?** — *Dr. Stanley Schade, RPC.*Two sons with different mothers were born to Abraham. Isaac's mother was Sarah, and Ishmael's mother was Hagar, an Egyptian woman who was a servant to Sarah. Hagar's son becomes the father of the tribe of Ishmaelites. Ishmael appears in the Koran as one of the Islamic prophets and as the forerunner of Muhammad. Thus, two great nations descended from Abraham.

January 11 — The Call to National Service: Reflections on My City Year Experience — Mr. Matt Gauen, Director of Youth Ministries, RPC. Matt spent the past two years as an AmeriCorps service member with City Year Chicago, and currently serves with Playworks Illinois, working in Chicago Public Schools. During his two years with City Year, Matt was able to witness the dropout crisis facing America's schools firsthand. His experiences did not come without challenges, both mental and physical, and tragedies along the way. However, through it all, he learned the power of national service, and how to become a catalyst for social change.

January 18 — **Riverside Township Food Pantry**— *Mr. Richard P. Tuscher, Riverside Township Supervisor.* Riverside Township currently offers a non-perishable Food Pantry to Township residents. Two pieces of current identification proving residency are required, and it is recommended that residents call the Township office prior to visit. No more than one visit per month is allowed per resident. The Food Pantry also accepts donations of non-perishable food from community groups and residents in an effort to help keep the pantry shelves fully stocked.

January 25 — Adventures in Taking Chances for Basketball Players and Their Education — *Mr. Jim Schmidt, Athletic Director, Plano (IL) High School.* Mr. Schmidt describes the amazing outcome of taking chances on young students from regions such as the Congo in Africa, as well as his efforts in the cultural and legal problems that have resulted. His feelings of hope for the education and athletic prowess of the young men that he has sponsored and worked with have had many personal rewards. His work has been well recognized throughout the Chicago region.
