#### **Summer Office Hours**



#### **Session Notes**


In May, the Session:


- Held a joint meeting with the Deacons to update each other on areas of responsibility and to share concerns.

#### **CARERS Corner**



# **Butterfly Garden**

The RPC Butterfly Garden has been planted! Now it's your turn to watch the various plants grow and report what butterflies you see to Steve Teune, Sandy Kappmeyer or Sylvia Schade. Try to identify the butterfly, or describe it, and note the date, time of day and the flower(s) that the butterfly visits. Please do not pick the flowers, since we would like to be able to give you seeds later. Visit as often as you like, and we will tabulate the results of your observations. Questions? Why are monarch butterflies declining? Three factors are commonly cited: Colder, wetter winters can be deadly, and hotter, drier summers can be lethal during the larval stage and can affect the survival and reproductive capacity of the adults. Monarchs may compensate for hotter summers by shifting their habitats north. In the winter, monarchs need mountain forests in Mexico for their habitat. Deforestation in Mexico has affected their wintering grounds, but the Mexican government has almost stopped illegal logging in the butterfly reserve. In the United States, monarchs need places to reproduce and feed. However, increased herbicide use (glyphosate/Roundup) is decreasing the availability of their primary food source, the milkweed plant. The use of the herbicide, together with increased planting of genetically modified glyphosate-tolerant ("Roundup Ready") corn and soybeans, has resulted in a sharp drop in Monarch butterfly populations. In the Midwest, there was an 81 percent decline in monarch production from 1999 to 2010 (scientificamerican.com).
