Kickball Tournament




Beloved friends:

August Share-a-Meal at *The Boulevard*



We also need 4 volunteers for service.



The Andrew Ministry at RPC



Andrew was the disciple who brought people to Jesus. In *John 1: 35-42*, Andrew begins following Jesus after John the Baptist said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew found his brother Simon (Peter) and said, "We have found the Messiah." He brought Peter to Jesus and the two of them became his first followers. The Andrew Ministry is dedicated to bringing people to Jesus by shepherding them into the community of faith through a mission of hospitality and spiritual mentoring. Trained Andrew Ministers are able to greet people as they enter the church and answer questions they may have, call on prospective members, connect prospective members to the various ministries of the church, shepherd people through the membership process and stay in touch with them until they are assimilated into the life of the church. The RPC Session has approved moving forward in developing and implementing an Andrew Ministry. Over the next several weeks the Elders will be nominating and inviting people to undergo training this fall as an Andrew Minister. We are looking for gregarious and outgoing individuals who like connecting people to one another and are willing to mentor perspective members. RPC CUMULATIVE DONATIONS vs. PREVIOUS YEARS

Mission Trip

On June 28, 13 students and 4 adults embarked on the 2015 Mission Trip to Cincinnati, Ohio. Despite some minor hiccups on the way to Ohio, namely some high water and closed roads, we arrived in Cincinnati ready to serve with YouthWorks, a Christian-based mission organization. Our group was split into two teams, one led by Lisa Marciniak and Matt Gauen, the second by Brooke Schwarz and Susan Lisle. The first group spent their week at the LeBlond Boys and Girls club, spending time with youth, reading books, playing games, serving food, organizing garages and doing other miscellaneous tasks. The second group alternated their days between a local garden center and a small congregation, helping with tasks such as organization, cleaning, gardening, sorting and other forms of labor.

Evenings were filled with activities organized by <u>YouthWorks</u>, including a rap concert with a local artist with an incredible, inspiring testimony. We also spent time at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center, a powerful and moving experience, and at a dual-language worship service at <u>La Viña</u>, a bilingual congregation in Cincinnati. Finally, we closed out our week with a cookout that, in spite of the rain, was a great success.

The youth did an incredible job throughout the week, persevering through early mornings and long days, and I appreciated their flexibility, their openness, their attention to detail and their hard work. I also want to thank the amazing adult leaders as well. Each day we were asked at the end of the day, "Where did you see God today?" Over the course of our week in Cincinnati, I saw God at work in each and every one of the amazing RPC Youth.

Thank you to Stuart (our lone senior!) Josh, Dima, Michael, Kaki, Abby, Alyssa, Natalie, Laura, Rachel, Mia, Eva, Sylvia, Lisa, Brooke and Susan, for an unforgettable first-time Mission Trip experience.




