Sunday, January 3, 2016 at 4:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary

Rev. Rosencrans has studied and led prayer and healing services for almost 30 years. This service will be especially focused on those grieving during the holidays. For those who have lost loved ones or had to deal with significant difficulties in the last year, the holidays can be challenging. Please come to this service of comfort, healing and hope to be encouraged by the prayers of God's people and surrounded by a loving faith community.

All are invited to bring their personal prayer requests for healing and wholeness as well. Bring to the Lord your wounds which will not heal, your relationships which refuse to be reconciled, your hurt, your pain, your despair, your anger, your sadness, all your losses and all your grief.

All elders are encouraged to attend for the laying on of hands as part of this prayer service, in accordance with scripture:

Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up: anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective.

CARERS



Blessed are the meek: for they will inherit the earth.


Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness: for they will be filled.

Q: What if I have a little one who needs to get to bed, and I can't stay for the classes/activities?

A: Come have dinner with us, anyway! You've got to eat somewhere, and we're willing to do the cooking!

Q: *Is there a fee?*

A: \$25 per person for the full set of weeks with a family maximum of \$100. If you drop in, it's \$5 per meal.

Q: What if I can't come all 6 weeks?

A: If you register, you can come whenever you can make it. If you don't want to register, we ask that you tell the office by Monday that you will be attending, and you can pay a "drop-in" price at dinner on Wednesday. We'd rather have you there once or twice than not at all!

Q: Do I really want to put another thing on my busy calendar?

A: In the past, WNL! participants were worried about this to begin with, and then found it was actually a relaxing mid-week break. Dinner out with friends? You can't beat that!
